Rising Waters: Youth for Climate and Water Justice is an Erasmus+ Youth Exchange that uses Venice as a "living classroom" to help young people understand climate adaptation and water justice, and to co-create practical, youth-led solutions. Through workshops, field-based learning, simulations and creative communication, participants build skills, intercultural awareness and a shared Youth Charter on Water and Climate Resilience.

ABOUT PROJECT

Venice is used as a “living classroom” to help young people understand the link between **climate change and water justice**, with a focus on sea-level rise, flooding (“acqua alta”), pollution, sustainable mobility, and community-based solutions. The project aims to empower participants to become active, informed citizens and to co-create a shared youth output (*Youth Charter/Declaration on Water and Climate Resilience*).

Specific objectives:

1. Raise awareness about the connection between climate change and water justice.
2. Equip young people with practical tools/skills to take action locally.
3. Foster international cooperation and co-create the *Youth Charter/Declaration on Water and Climate Resilience*.

Programme

Rising Waters: Youth for Climate and Water Justice

- **Day 1:** Arrivals
- **Day 2:** Energizers; “Rising Waters” mapping; team-building; Erasmus+ & Youthpass introduction
- **Day 3:** Global climate impacts; Venice water crisis analysis; solution ideas workshop
- **Day 4:** Circular economy basics; success stories; waste/energy in Venice; zero-waste art workshop + mini exhibition
- **Day 5:** 4R Adventure (Reject/Reuse/Recycle/Reduce); drought & water-conservation campaign design
- **Day 6:** Free day
- **Day 7:** Eco-scavenger hunt; eco-boat experience; green campaign design lab + gallery walk
- **Day 8:** Sustainable lifestyle workshop (with ADATA); water justice simulation; evaluation/reflection circle; farewell event
- **Day 9:** Departures

What activities are foreseen after the end of the Professional Development Activity?

After the exchange, the project continues through follow-up actions in each country:

- The participant network remains active (WhatsApp group kept as a long-term channel).
- Participants contribute to **digital guides, awareness campaigns, and reports** on the project themes.
- Each group shares outputs locally with peers, youth organisations, university clubs, and online communities, acting as **local ambassadors**.
- Partners promote sustainability of results through local ambassador actions, digital documentation, ongoing collaboration, and Youthpass reflection/action plans.

DISSEMINATION ACTIVITIES

Dissemination is a core part of the project and ensures the impact goes beyond the exchange week, reaching wider communities and inspiring concrete action.

1. Local dissemination in each partner country

Each partner country will organise dissemination actions such as workshops, presentations, school/youth-centre sessions, awareness initiatives, or community events led by participants and group leaders.

2. Online presence and digital storytelling

A dedicated project website and social media channels (Instagram, Facebook, YouTube) will publish updates, photos, vlogs, tutorials, practical tips, and testimonial videos.

3. Reports and educational materials

A digital report and a practical guide will compile results, best practices, and lessons learned, shared with schools, municipalities, NGOs, and EU/youth networks to support replication.

4. Events, webinars, and stakeholder outreach

Partners will support webinars/panels/cultural or thematic events where participants present outcomes to stakeholders, community members, and (when relevant) policymakers.

5. **European visibility**

Results will be shared with Erasmus+ channels, national agencies, European youth networks, and relevant EU platforms to amplify reach and alignment with climate and youth priorities.

Your role as a participant

Participants are expected to:

- Create and share multimedia content (photos/videos/blogs).
- Lead peer-to-peer workshops/presentations in schools or youth centres.
- Support local awareness campaigns and practical sustainability actions.
- Act as project ambassadors, promoting Erasmus+ opportunities and project messages in their communities.

Accommodation & How to Reach the Venue

The accommodation is a welcoming facility in **Spinea**, a peaceful town just outside **Venice**, ideal for youth group activities and learning. It offers shared rooms, common spaces, workshop areas, and a relaxed environment – perfect for developing empathy and inclusion.

Accommodation Details

Participants will stay in a **group lodging** facility equipped for Erasmus+ exchanges. It provides:

- **Shared rooms** (3–4 beds), separated by gender
- Shared **bathrooms**
- **Workshop & dining areas**
- **Outdoor spaces** for group activities
- **Wi-Fi** in common areas

 **Bed linen is provided** – remember to **bring your own towel**.

Meals

- Full board is included: **breakfast, lunch, dinner + coffee/snacks**
- Meals will be served on-site or delivered by a local service
- **Vegetarian and special dietary needs will be respected** – inform us in advance!

How to Reach the Venue

To reach Spinea and the venue, follow these simple steps:

Step 1 – Arrive in Italy

You can fly into one of the following airports:

- **Venice Marco Polo Airport (VCE)** – *recommended*
- **Treviso Airport (TSF)**
- **Bologna Airport (BLQ)** – *alternative (farther)*

Step 2 – From Airport to Venice Mestre or Venice Santa Lucia Train Station

► From **Venice Marco Polo (VCE)**:

- **Bus Line 15 (ACTV)** → to **Mestre Train Station** (~25 min)
- **Bus Line 5 (ACTV)** → to **Piazzale Roma (Venice)** (~35 min)
- **ATVO Shuttle** → to Mestre or Piazzale Roma (faster, luggage-friendly)

► From **Treviso Airport (TSF)**:


- **ATVO Bus** → to **Venice Mestre or Piazzale Roma** (~1 hour)

Step 3 – Take a Train or Bus to Spinea

Once at **Mestre** or **Venezia Santa Lucia** train station:

Option 1 – By Train:

Take a **regional train (REG)** to:

- **Spinea Station (Stazione di Spinea)**
 - Duration: **15–20 minutes**
 - Cost: ~€2–3

Option 2 – By ACTV Bus (Public Transport):

From **Piazzale Roma** (Venice) or **Mestre Train Station**, take:

- **Line 7**
- **Line 7E**

- **Other local ACTV buses toward Spinea**

🎫 Ticket: ~€1.50–2 (available from machines or kiosks)

🛑 Get off on **Spinea Giorgione bus stop**

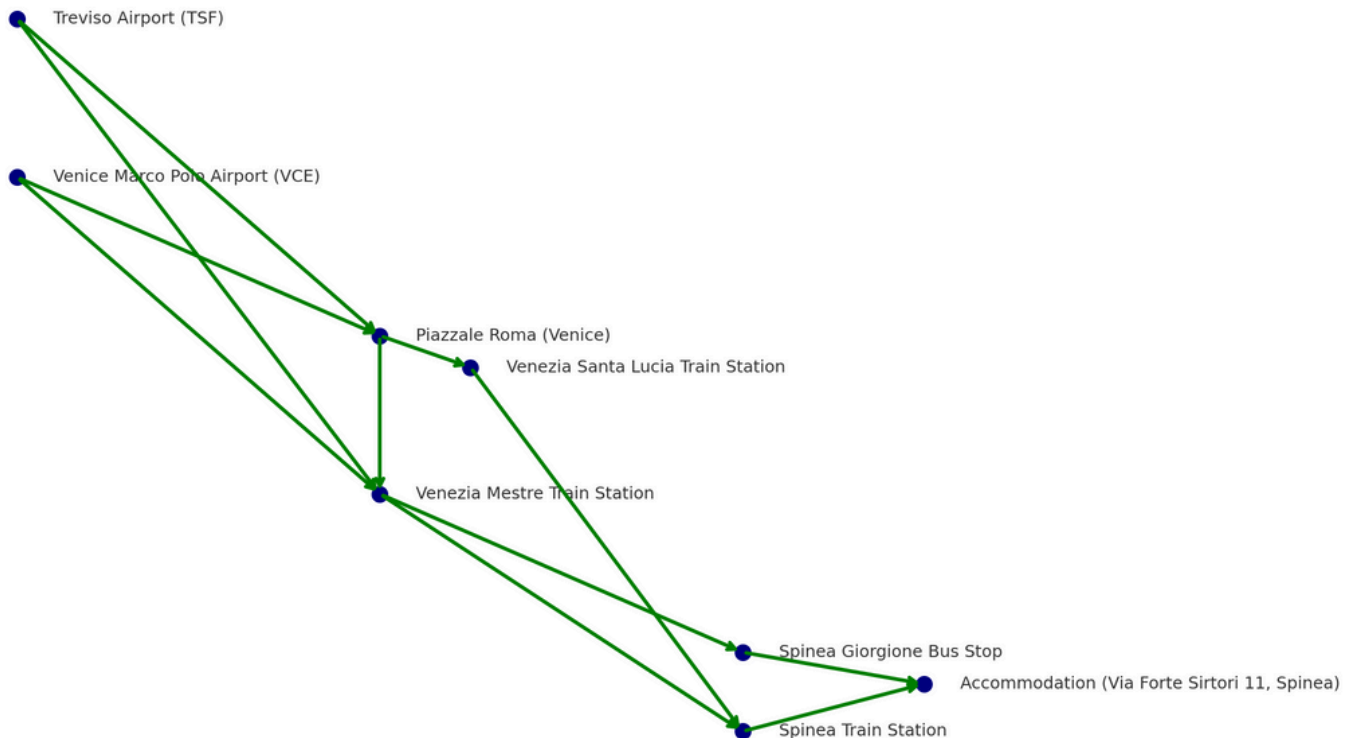
🚶♀️ Step 4 – From Spinea Station or Bus Stop to the Venue

- The accommodation is **5–10 minutes on foot** from the nearest train or bus stop.
- The hosting team may provide **group pickups** for coordinated arrivals – contact your group leader to confirm timing.

📌 Travel Tips:

- **Keep all tickets & receipts** for reimbursement (boarding passes, train/bus tickets)
- **Avoid taxis** unless agreed with the hosting team
- Prefer **eco-friendly travel** where possible
- Inform your group leader of your **arrival time in advance**
